Researchers welcome!

Co-located with the Nature Lounge at the CRC, The Residence will feature ensuite bedrooms for researchers, each with Wi-Fi and air conditioning. After all, science is essential – but it needn't always be hard work. A vehicle and professional Tracker will be assigned to assist researchers in their fieldwork. We can also assist researchers with obtaining the necessary permissions to conduct studies in the Greater Kruger. The beautiful Nature Lounge will be made available for reserve meetings, as well as providing a space to collaboratively run skills development and knowledge transfer programmes with local communities.

Ultimately the CRC is about nurturing relationships – between people and the planet, and with universities, NPOs and other highly regarded institutions. Our goal is to support NPOs and researchers as they go about the vital work of data collection, analysis and environmental education.



Tracker Institute

Successful conservation initiatives require passion – but also unique skill sets. South Africa has many skilled trackers, but opportunities to progress to elite status in this profession can be as elusive as some of the rarer creatures in the bushveld.

Operated in conjunction with legendary tracker Louis Liebenberg (CyberTracker) and led by Royal Malewane Head Guide and Master Tracker Juan Pinto, The Tracker Institute will give existing trackers access to the mentoring and advanced training they need to achieve the highest levels of their profession, and reach 'gold standard' certificates including Professional Tracker, Senior Tracker and Master Tracker.

Graduates of The Tracker Institute will be ideally placed to help raise standards across the industry, and enable more guests to experience the wonders of Africa's wild places on a deeper level. As a guest of The Royal Portfolio, you can also learn tracking fundamentals during your stay at Royal Malewane.
