Year 3	<p>Learn how and when Christmas is celebrated in France.</p> <p>Recognise and name historic Parisian landmarks.</p> <p>Recite simple finger rhymes such as Monsieur Pouce and songs such as Meunier tu Dors.</p> <p>Learn that Saint Saëns is a famous French composer and when and where he lived. Listen to the Carnival of the Animals and learn which animals are represented.</p> <p>Recite 1 and 2 times tables in French.</p> <p>Locate Lascaux in France learn what is depicted in the paintings, who made them and how they were made.</p>	<p>Christmas in France – including The Feast of St Nicholas. French Christmas Celebration Day</p> <p>Paris - Eiffel Tower, Notre Dame, Arc de Triomphe, and other landmarks. Artwork of Edouard Cortes (with Erik Satie's music)</p> <p>Finger rhymes and songs</p> <p>Carnival of the Animals- Saint Saëns</p> <p>Times tables in French</p> <p>Lascaux cave paintings</p>

	Key Objectives	
Year 4	<p>Learn that French cuisine is esteemed all over the world. Read simple recipes from each month of the year such as crêpes and la galette des rois.</p> <p>Locate the Dordogne valley on a map of France. Know that the Dordogne River runs through the area and that several sites of cave paintings are located there. Know that the capital town of Périgeux contains Roman ruins.</p> <p>Recognise and name landmarks of Marseille and Avignon.</p> <p>Locate significant cities on a map of France and learn why they are important.</p> <p>Learn that Ravel is a French composer born in the Victorian era and that Henri Dès is a Swiss composer who writes popular songs for children in French. Compare and contrast their music.</p> <p>Learn that Monet is a famous impressionist artist who lived in Giverny, outside Paris for many years. Be aware that Monet's house and garden are open for visitors to admire scenes that he painted.</p> <p>Learn that the River Seine is an important river that runs through Paris. Learn how it has been used in the past and how it is used today.</p> <p>Learn about aspects of language and culture of families within our school community.</p>	<p>French recipes</p> <p>The Dordogne</p> <p>Epiphany Cities in France- Marseille, Avignon</p> <p>Lyon, Nice, Calais , Bordeaux, Amiens, Dijon, Cherbourg, Nantes. Year 5	<p>Taste and appreciate crudités and learn that these are commonly eaten as snacks in France.</p> <p>Identify (and taste if possible) French regional produce.</p> <p>Listen to the music of Erik Satie. Learn that his work was usually written for the piano and is usually brief.</p> <p>Recognise artwork created by Gauguin, Manet and Pissarro. Learn when and where they lived.</p> <p>Learn that Vichy is a spa and resort town and of its importance as the capital of Vichy France during WWII.</p> <p>Know that Pierre Adolphe Valette was French, that he was Lowry's tutor and that he lived in Manchester. Recognise some of his artwork.</p> <p>Learn about aspects of language and culture of families within our school community.</p>	<p>French food-appetisers eaten with bread and fresh raw vegetables.</p> <p>Regional produce e.g. bottled water, Vichy pastilles and Nougat de Montelimar.</p> <p>The music of Erik Satie (born in Victorian era)</p> <p>French artists-Gauguin, Manet, Pissarro. (all Victorian era)</p> <p>The town of Vichy.</p> <p>Pierre Adolphe Valette</p> <p>Language and Culture Day</p>

	Key Objectives	
Year 6	<p>Learn key events in French history and compare this with English history.</p> <p>Learn about the lives and achievements of famous French people eg.Coco Chanel, Marion Cotillard, Thierry Henri and François Truffaut. Perform a traditional story e.g Le Petit Chaperon Rouge.</p> <p>Name, identify and locate important chateaux. Know that there are many chateaux in France.</p> <p>Recognise artwork created by Magritte, Seurat and Toulouse- Lautrec. Learn when and where they lived.</p> <p>Learn when, how and why France was occupied and how the occupation affected French people. (Refer back to Vichy Y5)</p> <p>Learn who made the Bayeux Tapestry, how it was made and what it depicts. Locate Bayeux on a map of France and Learn that the tapestry is on display to visitors in Bayeux.</p> <p>Learn about aspects of language and culture of families within our school community.</p>	<p>Learn about the history of France from pre-historic times to the present day.</p> <p>French Role Models.</p> <p>French Chateaux e.g. Chantilly, Chambord, Chenonceau and Versailles.</p> <p>French artists -Magritte, Seurat and Toulouse-Lautrec.</p> <p>WWII Occupation of France</p> <p>1066 William the Conqueror and the Bayeux Tapestry</p> <p>Language and Culture Day</p>
